<u>Literacy Spotlight</u> <u>Author in the Making: Learner, Rebecca Kennedy</u> Writes Her First Book!

Groundbreaking news! Rebecca Kennedy, an adult literacy learner with learning challenges, has written and illustrated her very first book, and she's just getting started! Rebecca meets with her tutor, Anne Siwek, every Wednesday afternoon. Since joining Anixter's adult literacy program, Rebecca has already advanced from a 3rd grade to a 4th grade reading level, a milestone that reflects her hard work and the power of personalized support.



Rebecca's first book began as a skit in her drama class, where she acted out a story with her friends Madison and Andrew about a ferret living in the jungle. With encouragement from her literacy tutor, Anne...and her drama teacher, Hailey, Rebecca turned that skit into a storybook. She named the main character "PJ the Ferret" (a nod to her love of peanut butter and jelly and to her brother's pet ferret, whom she enjoys spending time with).

Rebecca illustrated the book herself, using markers to draw three colorful scenes. Hailey then helped laminate and bind the book, giving it the feel of a real published story. PJ's story is a heartfelt one! PJ lives in a jungle full of fairy friends, but struggles with anxiety caused by noisy siblings. PJ dreams of having a quiet treehouse where he can meditate, rest, and recharge.

Writing the book wasn't easy! Rebecca said, "the hardest part was staying focused, but it was worth it". She went on to say, "I feel like a book writer," she proudly said. "Writing the book teaches me that I can write other books." Rebecca said she "worked hard" but the process was "fun". She now plans to write more stories featuring animal characters from her imagination.
